Recipe of the Month: Gingerbread Cake Submitted by Wilma Shockey

Ingredients:

1/2 cup shortening 1/2 cup molasses 1/2 tsp baking soda 1 1/2 cup flour 1 tsp ginger 1/4 tsp salt

1/2 cup sugar 2 eggs 1/2 cup cold water 1 tsp baking powder 1 tsp cinnamon

Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Cream shortening and sugar in large bowl, add molasses and
- 2. In a small bowl, mix water and baking soda together, then add to shortening mixture.
- 3. Add flour, baking powder, spices and salt and mix well.
- 4. Pour into a greased and floured deep 8x8 inch pan and bake for 25 to 30 minutes.
- 5. Serve hot or cold. Cut into squares and top with whipped cream or orange pudding sauce.


